


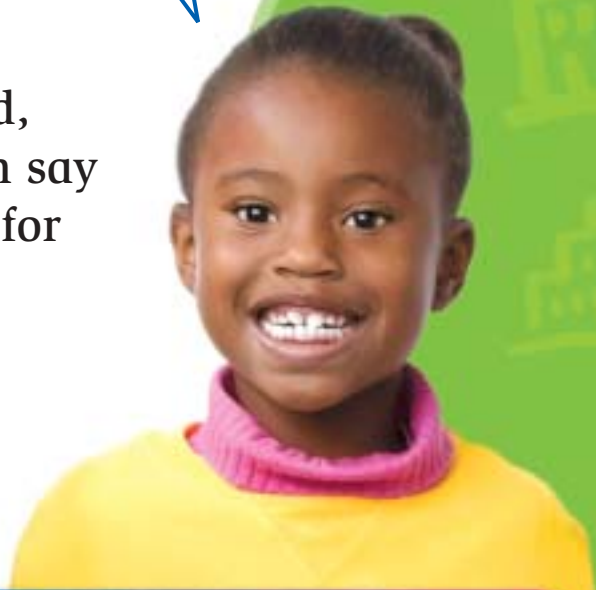
WE RESPOND

We can respond by

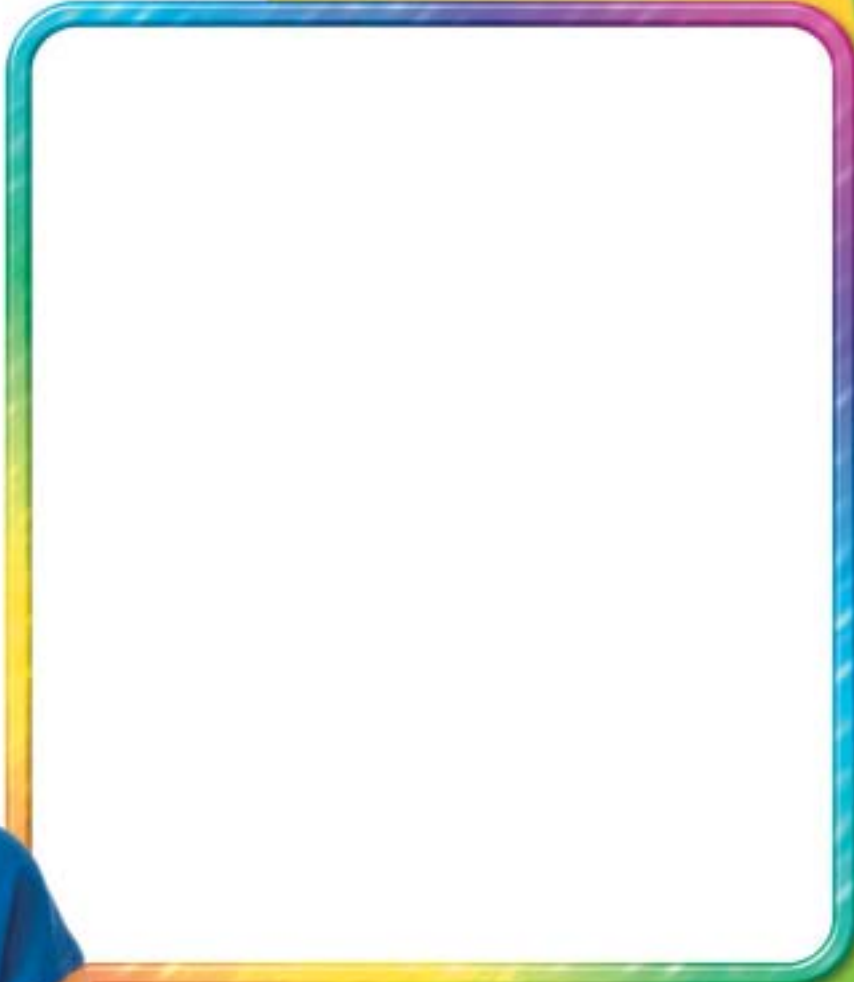
- thinking about ways our faith affects the things we say and do
